RULES

1. Now you are going to work in groups. Your group corresponds to your country.

 2. This country has to guess a person from another country chosen by the game leader. I am the game leader.
 3. The country which is playing has to ask questions to the game leader in order to guess this mysterious person.
 4. The game leader can answer only YES or NO
 5. The country that guesses in a shorter time wins.
 6. All the other players, not part of the playing group, have to switch on all the cameras.
The country asks a question to the game leader and depending on your answer (yes or no) you have to switch off or not your camera.
- For example: the country asks "is this person wearing glasses?", if the game leader says yes, all the people not wearing glasses right now, have to switch off the camera. If the game leader says no, all the people wearing glasses right now, have to switch off the camera.

- What is the most famous alcohol drink?




From Latvia to Bulgaria

RULES

- Now I will send you a link. We play a virtual game. Everybody has to click on the link in order to join the game.
- In this game you have to guess what a person is drawing.
- The website will choose a person who has to draw something. And there are three options. The drawer has to choose one. And draw it. He has time to draw and then the others have to guess.
- There is a keyboard with which you have to write the answer.
- The website will give points to the person who guesses first.
- You have to write correctly your answer because otherwise the game won't consider your answer. The person who makes more points wins.

RULES

- You all start with your cameras switched off
- In this game you have to switch your cameras on if you feel that the question suits you.
